



Mrs. Bernice (Ellis) Irwin

July 1, 1924 - April 8, 2015

A Celebration of Life will be held on Saturday, April 11, 2015 at 2:00 PM for Bernice Irwin at Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home in Henderson, Texas.

Bernice Evelyn (Ellis) Irwin was born in Hornbeck, Louisiana on July 1, 1924. She grew up in a close, loving family. As a young child, she was affectionately called “Tibby” by her siblings, which later in life became the name referred to her by her grandchildren and those close to her. Her family moved to Selman City, Texas in 1937, just months after the tragic explosion of the New London School on March 18, 1937. Two years later, her family moved to New London where she spent the rest of her childhood.

She graduated from New London High School on May 29, 1941 at 16 years of age. After her 18th birthday, she left New London to pursue her passion and attended Scott and White School of Nursing in Temple, Texas. While attending Scott and White, she witnessed the first penicillin drug introduced to that hospital; however, at that time, nurses were not allowed to administer the drug. She graduated from Scott and White as a Registered Nurse on May 14, 1945.

Soon after graduation, she moved back to East Texas where she met the love of her life, Billy Joe Irwin. They were married on December 11, 1945. Until Billy Joe’s death on January 17, 1984, they lived in Laneville. Billy Joe and Bernice enjoyed many exciting years as members of Sharon Temple Shrine Club, where Billy Joe was a member of the Mini Patrol and served on the Divan. She was a member of the Daughters of the Nile of Sharon Temple.

Bernice, often called ‘Bea’ by her colleagues, worked at Henderson Memorial Hospital for many years. In 1962, she became director of the Henderson Memorial Hospital Vocational Nursing School where she taught for 22 years. After retiring from the hospital, her next venture was with Visiting Nurses of East Texas (a Home Health Care Agency) where she became Regional Director in 1986.

In 1989, Bernice moved to Henderson where she joined Trinity Baptist Church. The Grace Sunday School Class was a big part of her life where she made and cherished many friendships.

Along with the love of nursing and taking care of family, Tibby absolutely loved cooking and eating good food. One of her favorite pastimes was reading cookbooks and finding

new recipes. She was best known for baking pralines, apple pies, and cakes. Making special desserts, birthday cakes, or pies for the special people in her life brought her extreme happiness and joy. After retiring from nursing, she pursued her passion for cooking by entering numerous recipe contests. Tibby won First Prize in Prevention Magazine's Healthy Recipe Contest with her entry of "Apple Yogurt Surprise" in 1995. Her legacy of cooking will live on through her four grandchildren (who all LOVE to cook) and through all those many friends with whom she shared her favorite recipes.

Bernice is preceded in death by her parents, John Barnett and Pallie Olivia (Belvin) Ellis, her husband, Billy Joe Irwin, and her sister, LaVerne Poole. She is survived by a son, Dr. Billy Wayne Irwin and his wife, Virginia, a daughter, Jetty Irwin Fahle and her husband, David. She leaves behind four grandchildren, Casey Wayne Irwin and his wife Emma, Kati Beth Wagner and her husband Graham, Jordan Lynn Fahle and Jenna Leigh Fahle. She was gifted with three great grand children, Emma Frances Irwin, William Bryce Irwin, and Lucia Beatrice Wagner. She also leaves behind a brother Wayne Ellis and his wife, Jean Ellis, a sister and special friend, LaMerle Poole. Also, numerous special nieces, nephews, great nieces and great nephews.

The family extends our heartfelt gratitude for all the loving care that she has received in the last few years of her life. A sincere thank you to "our Aunt Merle" (LaMerle Poole) for her steadfast love shown to Tibby throughout her life; to the staff and special nurses at Autumn Leaves Nursing and Rehabilitation Center; her long term caretaker for the last two years, Verlisha Stiggers; and lastly, to the wonderful nurses and staff of Angel Care Hospice for their exceptional care in the last days of her life.
