



Dr. Alfred Cameron Mitchell

October 20, 1936 - June 9, 2023

Graveside services for Dr. Alfred Cameron Mitchell, 86, of Cat Spring, formerly of Henderson, will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 17, 2023, at Lakewood Memorial Park. With Pastor Michelle Goss of First Presbyterian Church Officiating. Interment will follow under the direction of Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home.

Dr. Mitchell passed from this life on June 9, 2023, at Columbus Oaks Health Care Community in Columbus, Texas. He was born October 20, 1936, in Henderson to the late Thomas "T.L." and Rebecca (Cameron) Mitchell and graduated from Henderson High School. Cameron would go on to receive his Bachelor's degree from Sewanee: The University of the South and his Master's and PhD from the University of Texas. Dr. Mitchell joined the University of Houston as a faculty member in 1966 in the department of Quantitative and Management Science while completing his Ph.D. dissertation entitled "The Demand for Texas Refined Petroleum Products: A Study in Econometrics." As a faculty for 42 years, he taught statistics, operations research, database management, and computer programming. He also served in the University Faculty Senate among his many other service activities at UH. Cameron was honored with the title of Professor Emeritus of Decision and Information Sciences upon his retirement.

Cameron is also a private pilot with an instrument rating with more than 400

hours as pilot in command. Most of which were in his airplane, Cessna N5560C, a 170B tail dragger. He has also been an amateur radio operator (Ham) for more than 50 years and is a 50 year member of the ARRL.
