



Ms. Bessie Louise Chaney

February 25, 1946 - September 29, 2016

A celebration of the life of Ms. Bessie Louise Chaney, 70, of Henderson, will be held at 2 pm on Thursday, October 6, 2016, in the chapel of Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home with Chris Burris officiating. The family will receive friends from 1 pm until service time on Thursday at the funeral home.

Ms. Chaney passed from this life on September 29, 2016, at Autumn Leaves Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Henderson. She was born February 25, 1946, in Covina, CA to the late Julian M. and Honorina (Martinez) Verdugo. She was of Indian nationality of the Chumash and Mescalero Indians. Bess was a member of the original GRA (Girl's Rodeo Association). She joined the professional rodeo circuit as a professional barrel racer. She was a gold card member of the Women's Professional Rodeo Association and a Sierra Circuit Finalist for 12 consecutive years. Bess competed in the major professional rodeos including Salinas, Cow Palace and Reno. She was featured in an issue of Women's Sports Magazine, September, 1974. She was a member of the National Barrel Horse Association where she was the 2003 NBHA Senior 2D National Champion and a member of the Longhorn Barrel Racing Association in Texas. After her professional rodeo career, Bess continued sharing her skills and knowledge by teaching young children of all ages, basic horsemanship and how to compete in the sport of barrel racing. She was an instructor and mentor at several stables in California including Whittier Narrows, Sunset, Glenmore, Two Winds Ranch, Arroyo Seco Stables and

Riverside Equestrian Center. Working through the different facilities, Bess helped raise, mentored and loved her students as they were her own, making a lasting impact on many of their lives.

Bess worked as a vet tech for an emergency clinic in Temecula, California. She relocated to Texas with Rojo Ranch where she assisted in daily ranch maintenance in addition to caring for and training colts until her accident in February, 2008. It was evident Bess had a strong love for animals and outdoors. She was very health conscious often exercising, running and eating nutritional foods. Bess was an incredibly strong minded and strong willed individual. She attended Bar None Cowboy Church, and her love for the Lord was often shared. Her long time rodeo friends expressed she was an amazing competitor to watch and will always remember her beautiful long Indian braids. Through the trials of her paralysis, she never stopped trying or pushing herself to conquer obstacles placed before her. Her positive attitude and winning spirit is a legacy she leaves with all who knew her. Bess Chaney will forever be our champion.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by husband, Jack Chaney and Wade McComas, and her brother, David Verdugo.

Survivors include her niece, Vivian Dutch and husband Michael; great-nephew, Taylor Dutch; step-sons, Jerry McComas and Marty McComas; as well as numerous friends and loved ones.

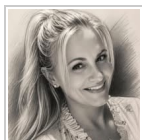
