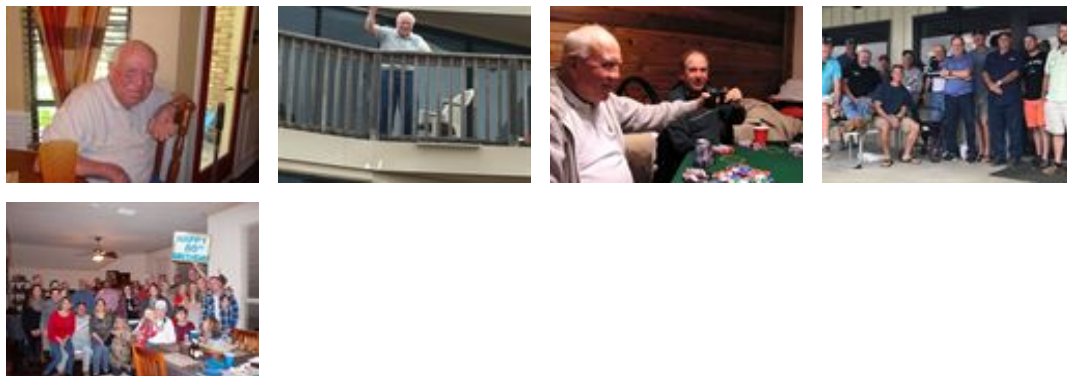
“ Barnett Family,
