James "Ebb" Everly Smith Funeral services for James "Ebb" Everly Smith, age 93, of Henderson, Texas, will be held at Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home in Henderson, Texas. Ebb Smith died May 9th, 2010 at home in Henderson, Texas. He was born on April 27th, 1917 in New Prospect, TX. Ebb resided in Henderson, Texas since 1937. He was a member of First Baptist Church. Ebb first owned Smith Brothers' Exxon with his brother Lovis and later owned Ebb Smith Texaco. He was also a constable in Rusk County for twenty years. Ebb and his brother Delma catered for Logtech. An avid outdoorsman, he managed and was a guide for a hunting camp in Goldthwaite, TX. Throughout his life, Ebb derived great joy from hunting and fishing. He was a phenomenal storyteller and a wonderful role model for his children and many grandchildren. During World War II, James "Ebb" Smith served in the Air Force. He enlisted in 1940 and fought in Northern Africa, the Middle East, and Southern Europe with the 66th Fighter Squadron of the 57th Fighter Group. As a Tech Sergeant, Ebb served in Africa, Sicily, Italy, Corsica, France, and Malta. He received six Battle Stars, three Presidential Citations, a Good Conduct medal, an EAME ribbon, and a Pre-Pearl Harbor ribbon. Ebb was discharged in 1945, after which he served in the USAF Reserves until honorably discharged in 1953.
