Esther Monthly Yancy passed away on Friday, June 29, 2018, at Autumn Leaves.

A memorial service and burial will be held in the Chapel of Angels at Forest Park Lawndale in Houston, Texas at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 28, 2018. The family will receive friends from 1 p.m. until service time on July 28, at the cemetery.

She was 96 years old. She was born in Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin on October 9, 1921, and was raised in Cresco, Iowa. Her parents were Olive Richards Monthly and Emil August Monthly. In 1941 she went to Oakland, California where she met her future husband, Steve Yancy from Coleman, Texas who was in the Navy. He was to be the love of her life. She was in the Volunteer Auxiliary at Henderson Memorial Hospital and also volunteered for the Depot Museum and Howard
