Mr. Glen Allen Walther, 76, of Newark, Delaware, passed from this life on May 9, 2026, in Newark, Delaware. He was born on August 26, 1949, in Dallas to the late Frank and Thelma Elizabeth (Copeland) Walther. Glen attended Hillcrest High School in Dallas and went on to the University of North Texas where he received his Bachelors degree and was a member of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity. Glen would go on to become a new product engineer for IBM earlier in his career and then went to work for W.L. Gore and Associates.
