Gilbert on Aug. 31, 1931, in Cincinnati, Ohio. Upon graduating high school, she traveled the world extensively and upon her return back to Cincinnati she met the love of her life, W.L. (Butch) Kinnebrew, who was a resident of Henderson, who had been transferred to Cincinnati for business. Grace was well known to the people of Henderson for her many years at Peoples State Bank, where she retired in 1994. Grace was always a doer, believing the way to make your town better is to be involved and she certainly was, dedicating most of her life to the service of others. Grace was a member of the First United Methodist Church, Henderson. She was a lifelong member of the Order of Eastern Star 494, lifelong member of Lions Club International, where she served as president, as well as Board of Directors. She was also awarded the Prestigious Life Membership for the Texas Lions Camp given only to those who have given exemplary service. She was a member of the Henderson Area Chamber of Commerce for many years and served as an Ambassador helping promote new business. In 1998, she was awarded the prestigious Ambassador of the Year of the Henderson Area Chamber of Commerce. Grace's proudest

achievement was serving three terms as city council woman for District 1, only stepping down due to failing health. She was a loving wife, mother, grandmother and friend and never stopped giving. She loved nothing more than a good laugh and taking care of her loved ones. Grace was preceded in death by beloved husband, Butch; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. W.L. Gilbert; her brother, Troy Gilbert; her grandson, Dylan Jacobs; dear friend, Sammie Jo Skeen; and many aunts, uncles and cousins.
