Memorial services for Howard Ray, 91, of Henderson, will be at 1:00 p.m., Tuesday, Oct. 9, 2012 at the Henderson Church of Christ with Bro. Leroy Sedgwick officiating. He was born Sept. 2, 1921 to Robert Lee and Martha (Hammett) Ray in Rusk County. Howard graduated from Carlisle High School in 1939. He then worked in the Civilian Conservation Corps before WWII, and fought in that war in the Pacific Campaign with the US Marine Corps. He also worked as a roustabout mechanic, and retired from Exxon after working there for 31 years. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Lucille Ray; and seven brothers and sisters.
