Ina Marie Simmons Rowell, 92, of Henderson, went to be with her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on December 13, 2019 at Autumn Leaves Nursing and Rehabilitation surrounded by loving family. Ina was born on August 1, 1927 at New Salem, near Henderson, to William Audrey and Mary Etta Morris Simmons. She trusted Jesus as her Savior when she was nine years old. Ina graduated from Henderson High School in May 1943 at the age of 15. She married Robert Wayne Rowell, the love of her life, on June 26, 1943.

Ina earned a BA degree in Elementary Education in 1970 with High Honors, a Masters degree in Early Childhood Education, and a Mid-Management certification, all from Stephen F. Austin State University. From 1980 to 1990 she enjoyed being an evening Adjunct Teacher of Early Childhood Education at the University of Texas at Tyler.

Most important to Ina was her salvation and her church. She was a long-time member of Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church. After the death of her husband, she moved to town and became a member of First Baptist Church. She taught children's Sunday school classes much of her adult life at Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church, and the Care Givers Ladies Class at First Baptist Church starting in 1998.

Her family and friends were very blessed by her love, her kindness, and her

example as a Christian. Her pride and joy was teaching at Henderson Kindergarten and then becoming principal in 1976. She treated the teachers, staff, children, and parents like family; she loved them all and never forgot their names. She loved to crochet and cook. Many benefited from a gift of a delicious meal or a crocheted item she made just for them. Ina was a much-loved mother and Nannie to her grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great-grandchildren. She will be greatly missed.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband of 41 years Robert Wayne Rowell, step-mother Lura Simmons, sister Juanita James, brothers Morris Simmons, Jack Simmons, John Simmons, Ralph Simmons, and Charlie Ray Simmons, and great-granddaughter Emily Grace. Survivors include daughters Linda Marie Rogers (David Earl) and Anita Reynolds (Elmer), sisters Syble Bassett and Judy Gilstrap, brothers Roy Simmons, Norman Simmons, and Michael Simmons, sister-in-law Imogene Maurer, brother-in-law James Rowell, grandchildren Chrystal Kirkpatrick, Justin Rogers, Melissa Clayton, Heather Johnson, Carly Allred, and Jared Reynolds, 12 great-grandchildren, four great-great-grandchildren, a special nephew Rodger Love, and numerous nieces, nephews, and friends.

“Beginning 70 years ago, Aunt Ina became a special part of my life. Due to family circumstances, I lived with Wayne and Ina, as well as my Grandparents, for a short period of time when I was 2-3 years old. I believe the seeds of our close family relationship were planted at that time. I grew to love Wayne, Ina, Linda, and later on Anita, as if they were my own family. Many times Ina would tell me “I wanted to keep you so bad! I know it was wrong, but I just couldn’t help it!” I have often thought about Ina through the years and the memories we shared together. She was such a special person and as the years went by I noticed how she would relate to others. She had such wonderful qualities that would make anyone at ease with her. She was always caring, loving, and gentle with people’s feelings, giving of her time and talents, and especially devoted to her family. She had a strong faith and attended Ebenezer Baptist and First Baptist where she spent many years teaching Sunday school for children and adults. I wondered sometimes if this was a matter of God leading her to what she was meant to do with her life—to teach. It took a strong faith as well as strength and determination to begin her college work later in her life. She took pride in her grades and ultimately acquired advanced degrees, while also doing what she knew was needed for her and her family. During our visits she would share her memories of her teaching experiences with me. I remarked how much times had changed since I grew up. In those days, corporal punishment was considered the everyday “norm” for those students who would stray outside the boundaries of “good behavior” during class. I admitted to her that I had “strayed” a few times during my earlier years and was rightfully the recipient of the appropriate “paddling.” (However, if the truth were to be told, I was actually more afraid of the additional punishment I would receive when I arrived at home after school!) I wondered how the teachers of today could possibly achieve their goals of teaching students when those measures were no longer available to them. She told me that she paddled a student only one time during her career (even when she was asked to do so by a student’s parents) and that experience lead her to believe there had to be another way.

So she decided that she would place a desk in her classroom that was intended for the occasional wayward student. She would tell the student that she felt that he or she was in need of some “private time.” The student would be placed at the desk near her and not allowed to interact with her or the other students until they reacquired good behavior skills. It worked—in fact she told me about one student who told her he liked to be near her! She was like that—she could always find the appropriate and non-threatening way to deal with a problem, while still accomplishing what was best for the other person.

Ina was one of those people you encounter in life who possesses qualities that all of us would like to achieve, but somehow we fall short. She touched so many lives during her time here with us and will leave a legacy that will last for many generations. I have only met a few people in my life who I respected so much that I didn't want to do anything that would let them down. She was one of those people and I will be forever thankful that God blessed me with knowing her.

My love and prayers are with all of her family and I know she is at peace and is now in the presence of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

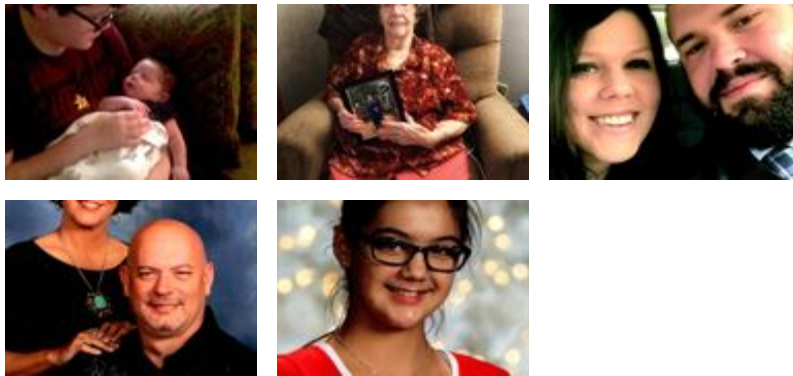

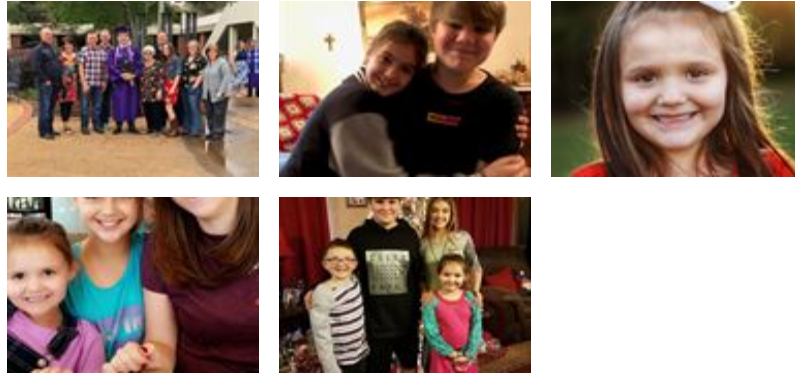

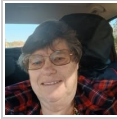
