



Mr. James E. Scritchfield

Mr. Scritchfield passed away December 7, 2017, at Henderson Health and Rehab. He was born Sept. 15, 1925 in Frankston, to the late William Henry and Mary Jane Scritchfield. He was the last surviving sibling in his family. James served his country in the US Army during WWII. He was a retired truck driver for Red Ball Motor Freight. He was a loving father and his "Shug's" best friend and rock, truly a daddy's girl and one of a kind papa. He loved bluegrass and country music. He was also a diehard Dallas Cowboy and Texas Ranger fan. He had a great love for dominos and represented Rusk County in the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo in the early nineties.

He was preceded in death by his son, Sammy Hendrix.

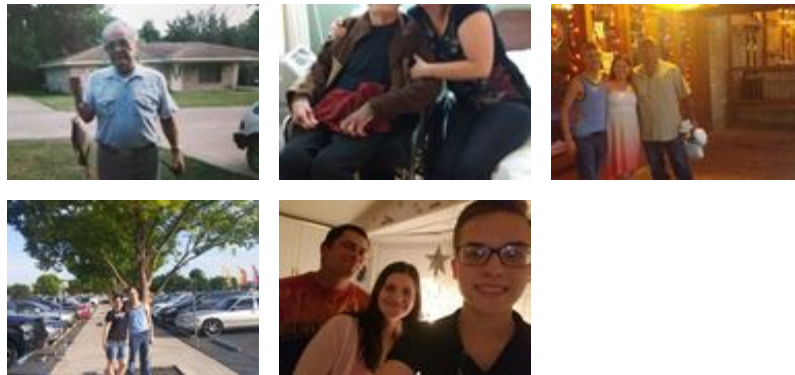
sweet Uncle, til we meet again in heaven.
