Hera Jeanne Anderson, a longtime resident of Houston, Texas, died August 13, 2015 at The Crescent in Sugar Land, Texas.

Jeanne was born August 19, 1923, in the Harper Community of Rusk County, Texas to Arthur Rade Harper and Hilda Grace Compton. She attended TSCW (now TWU) for 2 years, then married James Jewel Williams who was killed in action over Germany in 1944. Afterwards, she lived in the Howard Dickinson House in Henderson, Texas and worked for Dr. Hicks. Later she went to work for the Humble Oil Company (now ExxonMobil) in New London and met J. T. Anderson whom she married in August of 1947. They transferred to multiple locations in East Texas before settling in Houston in 1966.

She worked first for Anderson Greenwood & Company and then Houston Baptist University until she retired in June of 1982. After retirement, she and J T enjoyed their hobbies of trailering, seeing the United States, and working on genealogy.

She is preceded in death by her parents, Arthur and Hilda Harper, loving husband of 67 years, J.T. Anderson, and son-in-law, Russell Russell.

She is survived by son, John Anderson and wife Cindy, daughter, Becky Russell, sister, Jenna Harper Ashby, five grandchildren, nine precious great

grandchildren, as well as many loving nieces and nephews.
