



Joe Taliaferro

December 10, 1931 - July 6, 2010

July the 6th Joe Allen Taliaferro passed from this life to the next with his boys by his side. Joe will be buried at a graveside service for all family and friends at 10 a.m. Saturday, July 10, 2010 at Blackjack Cemetery with Rev. J.B. Williams officiating, under the direction of Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home in Henderson. The family will then welcome family and friends at Joe's house after the service. Joe was very proud of the family heritage in Rusk County, the family having arrived from Amherst, Virginia to Henderson, Texas in 1878. Joe Taliaferro was born in Houston, December 10, 1931. He graduated from Henderson High School in 1949 and then served in the United States Army during the Korean War. Several years after the war, he purchased and owned T and G Motor Company in Kilgore. A natural born geologist, he began his oil field career after divesting his car company. Though he had no college education or no formal training in geology, he became one of the most successful geologists in East Texas oil field history, discovering three fields including the Taliaferro Petitt field that produced over 1 million barrels of oil. After retiring he enjoyed nature and the fishing on the land that has been in his family 132 years. Joe is preceded in death by his parents, William Patrick (Pat) Taliaferro and Dora Belle Taliaferro; and grandson, Addison P. Taliaferro. He is survived by: sons, Mike Taliaferro and wife Suzonne, and Joe Hagen Taliaferro; granddaughters, Raley Taliaferro and Zoie Taliaferro; great-granddaughter, Kendyl Moore-Taliaferro; brother, Billy Pat Taliaferro; and many nieces and nephews and cousins. will be Johnny Vaughan, J.B. Williams, David Pickett, Tommy Cansler, Kenny Morris, and David Edwards.
