Mr. Roper proudly served his country in the United States Army during World War II. He spent his career as a salesman for Star Wholesale Drug Company and retired after close to forty years of service. It was said that he could sell a stick of gum to a fence post. Mr. Roper was a faithful member of First Baptist Church for many years where he taught intermediate Sunday School, Training Union, and RAs, and he was faithful to serve in the Intercessory Prayer Room every Thursday morning. He also loved to play 42 every Tuesday and Thursday, and later on, only on Thursday afternoons. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Leon Roper.
