Mr. Paul Langford Jackson, 66, of Austin, formerly of Kilgore, passed from this life on May 28, 2021. He was born October 23, 1954, to the late Joseph Edward and Kathleen (Langford) Jackson. Paul graduated from Kilgore High School and went on to Kilgore Junior College where he was in the band before finishing his education at the University of Texas at Austin. Mr. Jackson then went on to a career as a gate agent for Trans Texas Air and Braniff International Airways, among others, that allowed him to live all over the United States. Upon retirement, Paul moved to Ft. Worth where he was an instructor and taught computer for American Airlines. His love of music later inspired a second career as a musician and songwriter.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Joseph Edward Jackson Jr.

Survivors include a host of cousins, other family, and many friends.

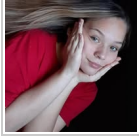
