



## Ray Edwards

April 30, 1930 - March 23, 2011

A memorial service for Ray Edwards, 80, of Henderson, will be held at 2 p.m. on Thursday, March 31, 2011, at Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home with Bro. Randy Sceroler officiating. Born on April 30, 1930, in Tyler, Texas, Ray Edwards was the third son born to Dovie and William Hampton Edwards. He graduated from the University of Houston in 1959 with a degree in Physics; his post-graduate career was with Eastman Kodak in Longview, Texas, where he worked as a scientist in the plastics division for 34 years. At Eastman, he developed 30 US and 168 foreign patents in plastic coatings and extrusions. After retirement he earned a certificate in corrosion technology from Kilgore College. His grandchildren claim he was the "smartest man in the world." He served in active duty in the US Air Force as a pilot in the Korean conflict. He was a POW from November 1952 to September 1953. He loved to read, listen to classical music, follow college sports and spend time with his family and pets. He spoke German, Spanish and Hebrew and had a gift for languages and embellishing language. He is preceded in death by his wife of 30 years, Patricia Johnson Edwards, his parents, Dovie and W.H. Edwards and two brothers, Dan Michael Edwards and Billy Matt Edwards. Survivors include: children, Dan Edwards and wife Suzette, Ben Linthicum and wife Kaky, Lisa McConnell and husband Scott, Patti Urbina and husband Eduardo, and Linda Prior and husband Luke; and 15 grandchildren.
