



Mr. T D Deason

August 5, 1940 - June 30, 2014

Funeral services for Mr. T D Deason, 73, of Alexandria, LA, formerly of Henderson, will be at 2 p.m., Saturday, July 5, 2014 at Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home chapel with Rev. Candice Klein officiating. Interment will follow at Maple Grove Cemetery under the direction of Crawford-A. Crim Funeral Home in Henderson.

Visitation will be from 6-8 p.m., Friday, July 4, 2014 at the funeral home.

T D was born in Henderson, August 5, 1940. His parents were Dr. Lloyd S and Sara Deason. They were both East Texas natives. T D attended Henderson Schools and graduated in 1958. He briefly attended Vanderbilt University. He returned to Henderson in 1959 and began working in the Henderson Hospital that his father had been instrumental in developing. A short while later he enlisted in the U.S. Army where he served as a signalman. Most of his tour was spent in Washington State. He was honorably discharged and returned to his employment at the hospital in Henderson. He was severely injured in a car accident a short time later. He suffered spinal cord injuries which resulted in paralysis. He spent the remainder of his life trying to learn how to deal with his condition. For many years he was cared for by his mother. Upon her death he entered the Veterans Administration long-term care facility in Pineville-Alexandria, LA. He remained there until his death on June 30, 2014. He received wonderfully, compassionate care in the V.A. facility and was loved by

many who worked there.

Survivors include: his daughter, Sara Brunk and husband Barry, Jr., of Henderson; grandsons, Ronald G. Boyd and wife Cynthia, and Alexander Boyd, and granddaughter, Eryn Brunk; great-grandchildren, Ariel Enkkeli, Kalie Soller, Aiden Soller, Kayla Nicole Boyd, and Kathryn Kay Boyd.
